#### Music:

Hello Parents and Families,

As the school year progresses, students of all grade levels are beginning to expand upon the knowledge and experiences they have gained at the beginning of the school year. This month, ask your student to show or sing these activities for you:

- Kindergarten- They chant this rhyme and do motions with their thumbs. "Two little blackbirds sitting on a hill. One named Jack and the other named Jill! Fly away, Jack! Fly away, Jill! Come back, Jack! Come back, Jill!"
- 1st- Students play the steady beat on a woodblock and sing this song. "Cobbler, cobbler, mend my shoe. Mend my shoe for half past two. Too-ra-loo-ra-loo. Half past two is far too late, mend my shoe for half past eight.

  Too-ra-loo-ra-loo."
- 2nd- Students are learning to sing this song in 3 languages! Ask them to sing it for you in French or Spanish. "Are you sleeping, are you sleeping, Brother John? Brother John? Morning bells are ringing, morning bells are ringing, ding dong! Ding ding dong!"
- 3rd- Students learned this silly rhyme and then decode it using rhythm syllables. Ask them to perform it for you with the words and using "du" and "du da di" "Oh, my, fish in the sky! Shoes on the ceiling and trees walking by! Reaching down low, bending up high, everything seems to be wrong, right?"
- 4th- Students are learning to read Do Re Mi on the staff after using their hands as a staff. Can they show you where Do Re Mi goes on this staff?.

# SAFETY AT BOWERS SCHOOL During Arrival and Dismissal Times

- Please see the map below which designates areas where student drop off is allowed. There is no parking or standing on Princeton Street in front of the school between Henry and Harvard. If you want to see your child enter the school building, please park your car and walk your child to the entrance door.
- The first bell rings at 9:00 and this is when walkers/dropped-off students may enter the building. While we make every effort to have a staff member by the arrival doors by 8:50 am, this is not always possible. Please do not drop off students early.
- All students and family members who cross Henry Street should do so at the corner with the crossing guard or at the cross walk by the entrance to the bus loop.
